From March 1, 2020, through May 13, 2020, the CareerSource Florida network continued providing high-quality services to Floridians during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Job seekers include Wagner-Peyser (277,104) and WIOA (38,872) programs.
Job seeker services include staff-assisted services and self-service.
Business establishments are distinct businesses, as opposed to one business entity
(e.g., this count could include services to 10 different CVS pharmacies).
