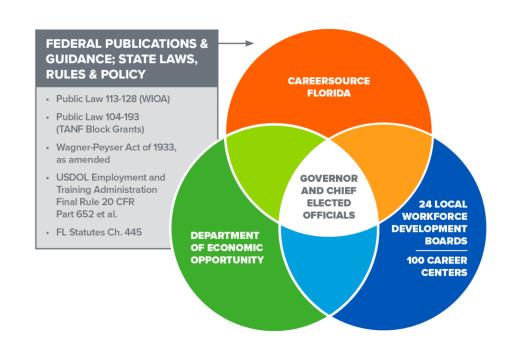

Pathways to Prosperity: Areas of Focus

- Two-generation, low-income family demonstration projects
- Call center training for job seekers with visual impairment
- Construction pre-apprenticeship program for GED completions
- Hospitality industry certifications for individuals with disabilities
- Serving ex-offenders on probation/re-entry placements
- Equipping individuals with disabilities retail/customer service skills
- Providing soft skills to at-risk youth
- Soft skills development/Cisco certification for women with barriers to employment



Pathways to Prosperity: Highlights

- Greater collaboration with service providers and stakeholders
- Increased technical skills for job seekers with visual impairments
- <u>Pre-apprenticeship construction program successes</u>
- Enhanced training and support services for two-generation, low-income families
- <u>Successful employment for individuals with disabilities and participants in SNAP, TANF and refugee programs</u>

 - Current year final grant evaluation year

Gig Economy

- Florida may be more likely to have more gig workers than the national average
- Industries with project-based or task-based work are more likely to employ gig workers
- Businesses may employ gig workers to ease recruitment demands and close hiring gaps, reduce direct costs and manage fringe costs, respond to seasonal and on-demand variations, support integration of new products or processes, gain access to new skills, languages, or talent and support market or product expansions



Traditional Work Arrangements

- Full or part-time wage and salary workers
- Self-employed/nonemployers in own incorporated business

Non-Traditional **Work Arrangements**

- Independent contractors
- Seasonal workers
- Temporary agency workers
- On-call or contract workers Unpaid family workers

Alternative Work **Arrangements**

Needs of Gig Workers

- **Online marketing services**
- **Industry specific training or** certifications
- **Skill or tech-specific** knowledge upgrades
- **Occupational licensing** needs
- Legal, tax preparation and employment discrimination protections
- **Business planning services**
