Credentials Review Committee Meeting Minutes December 1, 2021

I. Call to Order

Chair Katie Crofoot, Director, Reimagining Education and Career Help (REACH) Office, Executive Office of the Governor, called the meeting to order at 1 p.m. on Dec. 1, 2021, at the Betty Easley Conference Center in Tallahassee, Florida.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

III. Roll Call

Executive Coordinator Lisa Cramer conducted a roll call. The following members were present:

Chair Crofoot asked first time committee member Hugh Campbell to briefly introduce himself. Chair Crofoot also acknowledged designated proxy Marcelo Dossantos, serving for Kevin Carr and Emily Sikes serving as a proxy for Chancellor Marshall Criser.

IV. Consent Items

Chair Crofoot called for a motion to approve the meeting minutes.

- 1. Approval of the minutes for the September 8, 2021, meeting.
- 2. Approval of the minutes for the October 26, 2021, workshop.

There was no discussion and no comments from the public.

The consent agenda passed unanimously.

V. Learner Pathways: A Snapshot of Alignment in Palm Beach County

Chair Crofoot introduced CareerSource Palm Beach County President and CEO Julia Dattolo and Director of Educational Partnership and Strategic Initiatives Carrie Pasquale. Following the passage of the Reimagining Education and Career Help (REACH) Act, Julia and Carrie worked with education and workforce leadership in their county to implement findings from the Florida Chamber Foundation's Workforce 2030 report, which identified key sectors in the state's economy. The team then aligned these important sectors to their local economy and all credentialing pathways from high school to higher education. Julia and Carrie demonstrated to the committee how credential sequencing plays a role in local efforts to build talent pipelines.

VI. Update: Credentials of Value

Chair Crofoot introduced Florida Department of Education Statewide Director of Career and Technical Education Quality Keith Richard, Ph.D. Dr. Richard explained the Framework of Quality as a rubric by which workforce credentials are evaluated for inclusion on a Master Credentials List (MCL) for the state of Florida, in alignment with federally funded workforce accountability requirements. The accountability requirements include credential attainment, placement and median wage outcomes. Credentials to be evaluated include registered apprenticeship programs, industry certifications, licenses, advanced technical certificates, college credit certificates, career certificates, applied technology diplomas, and associate, baccalaureate and graduate degrees. The Master Credentials Lists will help the state direct funding to prioritize credentials of value and address the economic needs of Florida's citizens and businesses.

The following four data elements must be considered when defining the value of a credential:

- Labor Market Demand.
- Employment Outcome Thresholds.
- Earning Outcome Thresholds.
- Credential Sequencing.

Once the Framework of Quality is defined by the Credentials Review Committee, credentials offered in Florida will be evaluated against the framework for inclusion on the Master Credentials List.

A question was asked about whether the data in wage brackets for high school completers to associate degree occupations represents the current or first year of information. Dr. Richard said it represents a slice in time and the threshold represents information collected from Florida Education & Training Placement Information (FETPIP).

Florida Department of Economic Opportunity Division of Workforce Services Deputy Secretary Adrienne Johnston clarified that the information represents an average gathered from employers across the state.

In February 2022, ESG will complete all quantitative analyses and focus groups and provide a technical report for the Credentials Review Committee to use as a blueprint for decision making.

VII. Survey Results: Labor Market Estimating Conference Wage Bracket Preferences and Credential Sequencing

Chair Crofoot introduced Dr. Adam Briggs, Senior Director of Performance & Analytics for CareerSource Florida. Building on the information shared by Dr. Richard, Dr. Briggs shared an in-depth discussion on wage thresholds and credential sequencing and gathered the Credential Review Committee's input.

Proposed criteria for credential sequencing:

- Validated and recognized by industry.
- Part of a well-defined sequence of credentials that leads to a next-level credential on the Master Credentials List.
- And/or at least 25% of credential holders stack the credential to a credential of value on the Master Credentials List.
- Or included on Florida's Gold Standard Articulation list.

Dr. Briggs stated that the credential is valuable whether obtained at a university, community or technical college. The Credential Review Committee should determine what a well-defined sequence of credentials constitutes value and demand.

VIII. Building the Master Credentials List

Dan McGrew, Vice President of Strategic Policy & Performance with CareerSource Florida, provided an overview of an approach for consideration on how the Master Credentials List can be built, verified and put into action. Mr. McGrew stated they envision building the Master Credentials List by:

- Obtaining the Labor Market Estimating Conference Analysis of Occupations.
- Apply wage, demand and sequencing thresholds.
- Identify necessary credentials.
- Employer verification.

Master Credentials List.

Mr. McGrew stated that this process would replace the process for the Career and Professional Education (CAPE) Act. CAPE credentials will proceed through the Framework of Quality to be added to the CAPE list.

IX. Timeline Update

Andra Cornelius, Senior Vice President of Business & Workforce Development with CareerSource Florida, provided an overview of the timeline for the Credentials Review Committee. Ms. Cornelius stated that decisions impacting the committee since their first meeting have shifted. Many deliverables have been delayed. The Labor Market Estimating Conference's work will provide critical information about demand that will inform the Framework of Quality for credentials.

The Labor Market Estimating Conference will meet twice a year and its information will directly affect how credentials of value will be added to the Master Credentials List.

Credentials of value need to meet labor market demand as identified by the Labor Market Estimating Conference but can also meet local demand as identified by local communities.

IX. Open Discussion and Public Comment

A comment was made by Hugh Campbell that the pandemic will alter the data and that needs to be taken into consideration.

Chair's Closing Remarks

Chair Crofoot thanked everyone for their time and attention and noted that the committee is planning to meet for a virtual workshop in late January/early February after the Labor Marketing Estimating Conference convenes.

2022-2023 MASTER CREDENTIALS LIST

In 2021, Governor Ron DeSantis the Reimagining Education and Career Help (REACH) Act into law, creating a consumer-first workforce system that will address the evolving needs of Florida's economy by increasing collaboration and cooperation among state businesses and education communities while improving training within and equity and access to a more integrated workforce and education system for all Floridians. This legislation made changes to existing law and created a Master Credentials List.

As described in law, for the 2021-2022 school year, the Master Credentials List shall be composed of the CAPE Industry Certification Funding List and the CAPE Postsecondary Industry Certification Funding List adopted by the State Board of Education.

For 2022-2023, modifications to the current list were made to include the removal of certifications that are no longer available and technical changes to names or certifying agencies that have changed in the past year. The list includes 512 certifications, 320 of which have postsecondary funding eligibility.

Subsequent to approval of a Master Credentials List by the CareerSource Florida board and prior to the State Board of Education meeting at which the list is considered for a final vote, there may arise the need for technical revisions to the list. Examples of technical revisions include changes to certification names, change in the availability of the certification, or changes to code numbers.

Upon approval of a Framework of Quality by the Florida Credentials Review Committee, as described and required in the REACH Act, requests for certifications and credentials will be solicited and reviewed in compliance with the CAPE Act, the REACH Act and updated administrative rules. Newly submitted certifications and credentials will be added to the Master Credentials List and the CAPE Industry Certification Funding List with the approval of the Credentials Review Committee.

FOR CONSIDERATION

• Approve recommendations of 512 certifications for the 2022-2023 Master Credentials List and authorize the Credentials Review Committee to send these recommendations to the CareerSource Florida Board of Directors.

Framework of Quality Workgroups

Since January, the professional team supporting the Credentials Review Committee has convened four workgroups consisting of subject-matter experts from multiple agencies and various stakeholder partners. These workgroups were established around each element of the Framework of Quality, which will ultimately be used to identify credentials of value for inclusion on the Master Credentials List starting in January 2023.

Each workgroup is led by a member of the Credentials Review Committee and facilitated by a professional team member from one of the lead agencies tasked with implementing the Reimagining Education and Career Help (REACH) Act.

Workgroup facilitators also are members of a Steering Committee, led by Senior Vice President of Business & Workforce Development Andra Cornelius and CareerSource Florida Vice President of Strategic Policy & Performance Dan McGrew. Steering Committee members include professional staff from the Governor's REACH Office, CareerSource Florida, the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and the Florida Department of Education.

The Steering Committee supports the work of the Credentials Review Committee, establishes key deliverables and alignment among the workgroups, and facilitates interactions across workgroups as well as with external stakeholders and subject-matter experts as needed. Each workgroup is operating under a charter created to define the specific deliverables and primary considerations to contemplate. A brief summary of the progress of each workgroup is as follows:

Wage Thresholds

At bi-weekly meetings starting in February, the Wage Thresholds workgroup began considering conceptual approaches to establishing wage thresholds to recommend to the Credentials Review Committee for consideration, refinement, and ultimate adoption within the Framework of Quality model under development in 2022. Based on framing provided by the workgroup's Credentials Review Committee member, DEO Deputy Secretary Adrienne Johnston, the group is focused on two overarching questions: 1) What are the scope and limitations of the data available; and 2) What rationales appear to provide the most compelling justification for the wage thresholds to be recommended using that data?

This workgroup ultimately will require complete wage figures for all occupations to determine the full picture of what constitutes "mid- to high-level wages," a requirement of the REACH Act. The Steering Committee has asked the Labor Market Estimating Conference to provide a product that includes all occupations at all education levels, with entry-level wages for the same, which together will permit analysis of the more immediate impact of a credential earned on the credential earner.

The workgroup continues to focus on methodological questions and conceptual scenarios that can be analyzed through various simulation exercises using existing data sets. The analyses currently in development explore the scope, assumptions, limitations, interpretation and model development associated with the Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) data compiled by DEO as well as the actual wage record data reported in the Florida Education and Training Placement Information Program (FETPIP). Based on this work, the group will begin to construct models and rationales for what various wage threshold levels might look like.

Demand Thresholds

The Demand Thresholds workgroup has held three meetings since its inception in late January. The workgroup's primary focus has been on gaining a better understanding of existing demand threshold methodologies and processes used by DEO, CareerSource Palm Beach County, CareerSource South Florida, the state Department of Education and the Board of Governors in the following products: Statewide, Regional and Local Targeted Occupations Lists; the Statewide Eligible Training Provider List; Career and Technical Education (CTE) Audit; and Programs of Strategic Emphasis.

As the Labor Market Estimating Conference develops a supply and demand analysis product, the Demand Threshold Workgroup is reviewing the current

demand methodology as used by DEO (500 openings and 1.26% growth or 1,200 openings and any growth) and will review other methodologies, running various scenarios with the data and sharing with the other workgroups. In addition, the workgroup identified the need to gather more information on the local workforce development board processes for adding occupations not approved or identified on their local targeted occupations lists. Michael Corbit and Carrie Pasquale from CareerSource Palm Beach County developed a survey that was sent through the Florida Workforce Development Association (FWDA), gathering additional information to be shared and discussed in the next workgroup meeting, scheduled for March 4. A request is being made to FWDA to solicit their best recommendation on a standardized process.

In upcoming meetings, the Demand Threshold workgroup will continue to focus on the following points:

- The new demand methodology should include two criteria options, as it does now (x openings and x growth OR x+ openings and lower growth thresholds.)
- Deeper review of industry standards for establishment of the demand threshold methodology.
- Move toward more proactive anticipation of needs and ensure emerging industries/occupations can meet the new demand threshold as well.
- Focus on where the demand is captured need to ensure we are accurately reflecting demand in occupations that are not filled through the traditional methodologies, such as Employ Florida, Indeed.com, etc., for industries like construction. Ensure the new methodology takes a long-term view of demand.

Credential Sequencing

The Credential Sequencing workgroup has held two meetings to date. The primary focus of these meetings includes: 1) A reflection from members on definitions of "sequencing" and "stackability;" and, 2) A review of the recommendation of Education Strategy Group (ESG) on stackability.

For the definition of sequencing, concepts discussed included lifelong learning, career pathways with clear steps, skills upgrades for the currently employed, clearly identified progression to another level, wage gains along the sequence, and evidence that the sequence is used.

In addition to definitions, the workgroup reviewed the following ESG recommendation for stackability:

Non-degree credentials that don't meet Florida's demand and middle/high wage thresholds can be part of Florida's Credentials of Value list if they:

- 1. Meet or exceed a "floor" wage threshold of 200% of the federal poverty level.
- 2. Are part of a well-defined sequence of credentials that lead to indemand, family sustaining wage opportunities.
- 3. Are validated and recognized by industry.
- 4. Are included on Florida's gold standard articulation list OR are part of statewide articulation agreements.
- 5. Offer evidence that a percentage of credential holders "stack" that credential to a Credential of Value in a well-defined sequence to be implemented over time.

Members expressed support for all concepts in general with recognition that some of the conditions listed may be necessary and others may be sufficient. Future discussions will focus on additional concepts that should be considered and a prioritization of the conditions for stackability.

Credential-Occupation Correlation and Gap Identification

The Credential-Occupation Correlation and Gap Identification workgroup held its first meeting Feb. 4. The primary goal of this workgroup is to establish the list of credentials currently offered in Florida that should be reviewed by the Credentials Review Committee through the Framework of Quality to determine which credentials should appear on the Master Credentials List. Further, the intent of this workgroup is to develop a process by which new credentials can be identified as they are offered for the first time in Florida, so these credentials can also be reviewed by the Credentials Review Committee through the Framework of Quality as they emerge for consideration of additions to the Master Credentials List. Finally, this workgroup intends to develop a process by which the Credentials Review Committee can identify credentials that are not currently offered in Florida, but are identified as a valuable credential to Florida, based on current or emerging labor market demand.

In the first workgroup meeting, Dr. Keith Richard provided a high-level overview of the status of credential inventories among two of the postsecondary sectors in Florida. Credentials Review Committee member James Taylor and workgroup member Byron Clayton discussed how this group should also emphasize an approach of contacting employers to better understand the needs of the workforce.

Since the first meeting, the team has compiled an inventory of the postsecondary programs currently offered in the following postsecondary sectors: Florida College System, district technical colleges, State University System and Commission for Independent Education. The workgroup is still working on compiling an inventory of the credentials offered in the Independent Colleges and Universities (ICUF), as well as the industry-recognized certifications available to students in Florida.

It is important to note that the industry certifications are not specific programs offered at a given institution, but rather tied to various postsecondary CTE programs. For this reason, it may be challenging to capture the entire universe of industry certifications that exist. However, the team has started by compiling the industry certifications that are approved for Perkins V funding and CAPE Industry Certification funding within the districts and FCS institutions.

At the next workgroup meeting, scheduled for March 7, the workgroup will discuss how each of the postsecondary sectors (Florida College System, districts, State University System, Commission for Independent Education and ICUF) collect and maintain their program inventories. This discussion, facilitated by presentations from representatives within each sector, will allow the workgroup to better understand what processes can be developed to ensure the Credentials Review Committee regularly receives updates on the programs that are offered or are anticipated to be offered in Florida.

CRC Cross-Agency Support Workgroups Steering Committee

Background

Florida House Bill 1507 created Chapter 14.36, Florida Statutes, the Reimagining Education and Career Help (REACH) Act, to address the evolving needs of Florida's economy by increasing collaboration and cooperation among state businesses and education communities while improving training within and equity and access to a more integrated workforce and education system for all Floridians. As prescribed in the law (445.004(h)1), the Credentials Review Committee will identify nondegree credentials and degree credentials of value for approval by the CareerSource Florida Board of Directors and inclusion on the Master Credentials List. Such credentials must include registered apprenticeship programs, industry certifications, licenses, advanced technical certificates, college credit certificates, career certificates, applied technology diplomas, associate degrees, baccalaureate degrees and graduate degrees.

The efforts and outputs of this workgroup relate directly to an identifiable element within the Framework of Quality that will ultimately be adopted by the Credentials Review Committee and then used to identify credentials to be included on the Master Credentials List.

Key Deliverables

- Identify all relevant information to include on the Master Credentials List and determine final format of the list.
- Identify resources available to apply the Framework of Quality and develop both the initial Master Credentials List and ongoing additions/deletions from the Master Credentials List.
- Develop a communications plan for Master Credentials List members and interested stakeholders to keep the public informed of the work being undertaken.
- Develop agendas and materials for scheduled Master Credentials List workshops and meetings.
- Develop recommended returned value funding formula along with additional postsecondary funding designations called for in the REACH Act.

- Develop an ongoing master calendar for future years establishing a regular cycle of updates to the Master Credentials List and Framework of Quality.
- Develop a process by which new credentials may apply to be added to the Master Credentials List.
- Establish a process by which Standard Occupational Classification codes are assigned to new credentials on the Master Credentials List.

Key Activities and Preliminary Considerations

- Consideration of resources needed must consider that there is currently no dedicated funding to support the work of the Credentials Review Committee.
- Considerations for the communications plan include maintaining engagement of Credentials Review Committee members not assigned to workgroups along with primary stakeholders including businesses in key industries/potential critics through awareness of ongoing work.
- Returned value funding and other funding designations may be reviewed by various stakeholders within the Florida Department of Education to ensure understanding of intent of the legislation.
- The committee should consider all related decisions and processes that point to the Master Credentials List or Framework of Quality including CAPE, CTE Audit, and Section 35 program additions.
- Ensure early identification of collision points for the Framework of Quality workgroups.
