



CAREERSOURCE FLORIDA NETWORK IMPACT

All data included is from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023 and was provided by FloridaCommerce.

From July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023, the CareerSource Florida network served nearly 94,000 Employ Florida participants, through Wagner-Peyser Act funding. These services, such as resume writing assistance and interview preparation, broaden the talent pool for businesses by helping Floridians find jobs and advance in their careers.

From that pool, the CareerSource Florida network served nearly 15,000 individuals who require additional services to enter or advance in the job market, through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funding. These services take longer to deliver and include individual case management, development of individual employment plans, upskilling through training services, provision of wrap-around services, referrals to community partner programs, and more. Participants experiencing barriers to employment, such as low-income, deficient in basic skills, on public assistance, previously incarcerated, military veterans, and at-risk youth ages 16 to 24, earned 11,719 credentials that lead to in-demand, mid- to high-wage occupations.

Amid a tight labor market and exceptionally low unemployment, the CareerSource Florida network also serves businesses that are struggling to find and retain talent. Last year, the network served 50,736 businesses.

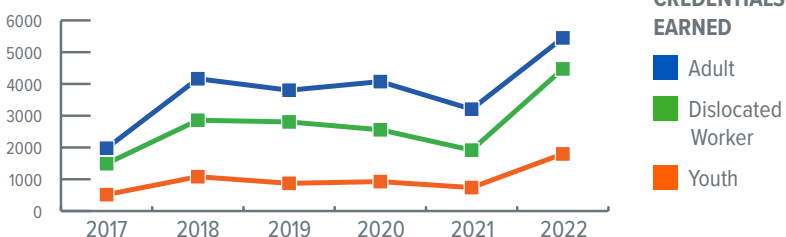

As another successful outcome of the REACH Act, Florida has created its first Master Credentials List, which helps ensure the state's education system aligns with the projected talent needs of industry. The list, produced through the work of the Credentials Review Committee, is a comprehensive roster of state-approved degree and non-degree credentials that prepare Floridians for in-demand occupations.
