25-26 Network Budget Recap

- \$111.9 Million in Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Funds
- \$38.3 Million in Wagner-Peyser Act Funds
- 15% of the WIOA funding (\$16.8 million) for state-level set-aside initiatives
 - \$3 million to the Incumbent Worker Training Program
 - \$3 million to the Sectors of Strategic Focus Training Initiative
 - \$2 million to Rural Initiatives
 - \$750,000 to Advancing Florida's Workforce System
 - \$750,000 to Youth Career Exploration



OJT & ITA Statewide Waivers

- On-the-Job Training (OJT) Waiver request formally submitted by Florida Commerce
- Individual Training Account (ITA) Waivers are under review for approval with the CareerSource Florida Board of Directors



End-of-Year Wrap Up

- Since July 2023, WIOA set-aside funded initiatives have:
 - Served 938 individuals
 - Provided 911 training services
 - Earned 650 credentials for participants
